

CARES ACT

Snead State Community College signed and return to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement for CARES funds on Friday April 24, 2020.

How much in CARES Act funds was Snead State Community College awarded for emergency student aid?

\$619,599

Who is eligible for CARES Act funds?

Students who meet all of the following criteria as defined by the U.S. Department of Education guidelines:

- Students enrolled in the Spring Semester at Snead State Community College. (Exception, students registered for the mini I term only are not eligible)
- Students working towards a degree or certificate program at Snead State Community College
- Students enrolled in at least one traditional on campus course at Snead State Community College
- Students with a valid 2019-2020 FAFSA on file, or students eligible to apply for a FAFSA
- Students who have satisfactory academic progress (SAP) status
- Students who are required that are registered with Selective Services

Who is not eligible for CARES Act funds?

Students with any of the following are not eligible to receive CARES funds:

- Students enrolled exclusively in online courses.
- Students who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents (green card holders)
- Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) students
- Dual enrolled high school students
- Students who do not have a valid high school diploma or equivalent
- Incarcerated students
- Students enrolled exclusively in Spring Mini I term
- Students who withdrew from all classes prior to March 16, 2020

How will eligible student receive CARES Act funds?

A check will be mailed to the student address on file as of May 19, 2020.

Are there guidelines/requirements on how students can spend CARES Act funds?

No, there are no limitations.

How many Snead State Community College students were eligible to receive CARES Act funds?

979 students (44% of spring semester enrollment)

How will Snead State Community College spend/disburse CARES Act funds?

Dorm students were required to vacate the dorm due to COVID closure, students will receive a pro-rate refund based on the number of weeks that remained in the semester. Sixty students were issued refunds totaling \$40,827.

Students with board tickets will receive a pro-rated refund based on the number of weeks that remained in the semester after the COVID closure. Sixty students were issued refunds totaling \$22,920.

The remainder of the CARES student emergency aid was disbursed to eligible students as Technology grants. 979 eligible students were issued \$564.84 each for a total of \$552,978.36.
