

ARP STUDENT FUNDING

AS OF SEPTEMBER 30, 2021

- **On May 14, 2021 Snead State Community College received funding for the 2021 ARP 50% Advanced Student Funds.**
- **How much 2021 ARP funding was Snead State Community College awarded for emergency student aid?**
 - \$2,499,098
- **How may students use their emergency financial aid grants?**
 - Emergency financial aid grants may be used by students for any component of their cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care. Students determine how they may use their emergency financial aid grant within the allowable uses.
- **Can an institution direct or control what students may use their emergency financial aid grants on?**
 - No. The student emergency financial aid grant is provided to the student, and may be used by the student for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care), or child care.
- **Will students be asked to apply for the 2021 funds?**
 - No, applying will not be a requirement for the funds. When the college determines the disbursement process, all eligible students will be included.
- **Did students with a current outstanding balance receive a student grant?**
 - Yes, student accounts with a current outstanding balance received an ARP grant refund, and the balance will still need to be paid in full.
- **What was the source of the total funding for issuing these students grant?**
 - **ARP Student Grant**
 - SU21 \$706,200
 - FA21 \$1,123,200
- **What was the amount awarded per student grant and how many students were awarded?**
 - **Summer 2021**
 - 343 Title IV (Pell) students were awarded \$600 each
 - 1,668 Non-Title IV students were awarded \$300 each.
 - **Fall 2021**
 - 865 Title IV (Pell) students were awarded \$800 each
 - 1,078 Non-Title IV students were awarded \$400 each
- **Will students have to pay this money back?**
 - No, students will not be required to pay this money back.
- **Are emergency financial aid grants to students under the HEERF program considered taxable income?**
 - No. Emergency financial aid grants made by a federal agency, State, Indian tribe, higher education institution or scholarship-granting organization (including a tribal organization) to a student because of an event related to the COVID-19 national emergency is not included in the student's gross income.
- **Snead State still has a remaining balance of \$669,698 in ARP Student Grant funding. Students are encouraged to verify their mailing address and update if needed or set up their electronic refund account. Fall 2021, with the exception of student ONLY enrolled in Mini II class(es), have already received their refund.**
