



PRESIDENT'S CABINET MEETING

November 10, 2022

Old Business

1. Enrollment and Target X Update

- Fall enrollment is 23, 882 with credit hours and 2,508 in headcount.
- Currently, Spring enrollment is trending at an increase with 7,226 credit hours over the number this date in 2021, which was 6,350 credit hours, and with 694 in headcount over the number recorded on this date in 2021, which was 587.
- The Cabinet discussed areas for growth among the various student types.

New Business

1. Walmart Community Grant (Parson Pantry)

- Caitlyn Dickerson and Amanda Gentry have requested to submit an application for a \$5,000 grant for the Parson Pantry. Mr. Scott made a motion to approve the request with Dr. Randall voicing a second. The Cabinet approved unanimously.

2. ACCS Success Coach Grant

- Mr. Cannon presented a request to apply for a Success Coach grant.
- Mr. Scott made a motion to approve the request with Mr. Roden voicing a second. The Cabinet approved unanimously.

3. Board of Trustees Update

- Dr. Whitmore provided an update from the meeting yesterday.

- Matthew Woods resigned from the Board after winning an election to serve as State Representative for District 13.
- Two board members, Blake McAnally and Milton Davis, have terms that are ending. Announcements haven't been made as to who will be appointed to those positions.
- The board approved a resolution giving the Chancellor authorization to award bids as they come in for the different Technology Centers being constructed within the System.

4. Technology Center Update

- The bid opening for the project was held last Thursday.
- Snead State's facility and Gadsden's facility were let for bid together.
- Snead State received three bids for the project. Dr. Whitmore expects to receive a contract for the construction project within a week.

5. Open Discussion

- The lighting project for the ball fields will start soon. The project should be completed by the end of January in time for the first home game.
- A system wide directive is being implemented requiring armed security officers on campus. The College will soon have a police department on campus to be in compliance with the directive.
- Mr. Roden reported on the IT directors meeting on Wednesday. The System office has hired three new employees for the IT department.
- Ms. Smith reported that the System office is planning a Media Day for each region, and Snead will be included in one planned at the Calhoun-Decatur campus. A date has not yet been set.
- Dr. Randall said the next Perkins Grant application has been submitted. The ACTE Region II competition will be occurring again in March 2023.
- Mr. Cannon led discussion on the Dual Enrollment grant. Tonight is the Dual Enrollment Information Night being held at the McCain.
- Dashing through Downtown in Boaz will Friday and Saturday. Horse and carriage rides will go in front of the Story Administration Building, and holiday decorations have been put up.
